## SAH Recruits IT Professional Through TAG

An Elliot Lake native, Chad Carter recently found his way back to Northern Ontario. Chad was the Manager of Technical Services at the Grand River Hospital in Kitchener when he learned of the Sault Ste. Marie Innovation Centre's TAG luncheons.

By tele-conferencing in to attend the luncheons, Chad met Julian Piwowski, Manager of Information Systems at Sault Area Hospital. A short time later, Julian informed Chad of an upcoming opportunity. Chad suited the requirements for the Senior Systems Support vacancy at the Sault Area Hospital and moved to Sault Ste. Marie.

As Senior Systems Support,

Chad is responsible for the servers and networks, planning and support for the hospital.

There are approximately 1300 end-user devices on the hospital's network spread across two main sites (the General and the Plummer) and eight remote sites with approximately 2000 users (nurses, clinicians, support staff) and 80 application servers. And it is expanding!

The hospital is expanding its network and focusing on stabilizing the environment to make way for new developments in healthcare technology. For example, the hospital is preparing to implement a PACS system. The PACS system improves the quality of and

accessibility to patient images. The PACS system stores patient images and information digitally which gives patients/ physicians

immediate access to these images and improves the radiology departments' ability to store, retrieve, review, diagnose, and distribute patient medical images and accompanying information. In addition to the PACS system, a wireless network is planned

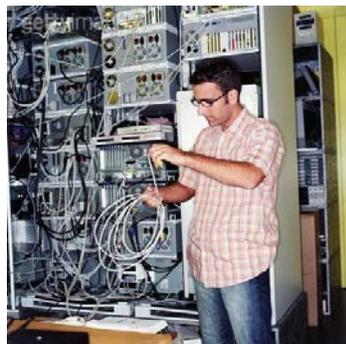
